I. The Conference

The CTE Research and Professional Development
Conference is the foremost peer-reviewed conference for
CTE researchers and academic professionals. This
conference is coordinated by the ACTE CTE Research
Section in the New and Related Services Division.
Previously, this conference was coordinated by the ACTER.

The conference is December 3 – 4, 2024 in San Antonio, Texas. The conference will be held in conjunction with the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE) CareerTech VISION 2024. The conference theme is Shaping CTE for the Next Generation Workforce.

ACTER, OTT, and University Council invite researchers to submit manuscripts and proposals to be considered for presentation at the conference. Graduate students are highly encouraged to submit proposals for consideration. Presentations are selected via blind review.

The 2024 program will feature five types of sessions:

- Research paper presentations (full paper)
- Research paper presentations (extended abstracts)
- Research posters
- Symposia
- Research roundtable discussions

II. General Procedures and Policies

All authors/presenters must abide by these procedures.

- 1. *Deadline*. The online submission system will be closed on Sunday, June 2 at 11:59 p.m. Eastern Time. No late submissions will be accepted.
- 2. Format. Each session type has its own format. Reviewers

- may reject submissions without review if the proposal does not comply with the requirements outlined in this announcement.
- 3. Author attendance requirement. Submission is a commitment to attend the conference. Authors who present at the CTE Research and Professional Development Conference must register for this conference. In the case of multi-authored papers, at least one author must register for and attend the conference.
- 4. *Double-blind, peer review.* Papers are assigned to two or three reviewers, chosen for their familiarity with the proposal's content and/or methodology. Proposals are reviewed without author identification. Submissions should not include explicit or implicit references that identify the authors.
- 5. Notification of acceptance. The conference committee will notify the corresponding author of acceptance or rejection by **July 15**th, **2024**. Papers and abstracts not accepted may be considered for roundtable or poster presentations.
- 6. Communication. The conference committee will communicate with the corresponding author who will be responsible for informing co-authors.
- 7. Equipment. Presenters are responsible for bringing computers for their presentations. Projectors and screens for sessions will be set up for the conference.

III. Guidelines for Authors and Presenters

Research papers (both full and extended abstracts), posters, symposia, and research roundtable proposals must be submitted through the ACTER 2024 Conference
Submission Link. Details can be found on the last page of this document.

GRADUATE STUDENTS

Graduate students are encouraged to submit proposals. A stipend will be provided to graduate students who submit and attend the closing session.

Research Paper Sessions

The conference provides two types of research paper opportunities. The first is a full research paper and the second is an extended abstract. Research paper sessions are designed for refinement and discussion of research in CTE. Each 75-minute session (20 minutes for each presentation) features three manuscripts, clustered by the similarity of the topic or research methodology. Following the 20-minute presentation, a discussant offers commentary about the paper and leads audience questioning. The discussant also will provide written feedback that may help the author(s) improve the paper for submission to the CTE Research (CTER) journal or the Journal of CTE (JCTE).

ACTER coordinates the double-blind, peer review of research papers. Conference reviewers rate research papers with these selection criteria: Purpose, conceptual or theoretical framework, methodology, findings, conclusions, and relevance to the conference theme. Research Paper Proposal Requirements (full and extended abstracts)

- a. Limit full manuscript to 12 pages excluding references.
 Extended abstracts should range from 5 7 pages excluding references.
- b. Remove all identifying information (e.g. authors' names and institutional affiliation) from the text.
- c. Do not include a title page. Instead, page one should include the title (centered and bold-faced on the first line, followed by a single-spaced abstract of no more than 120 words). Begin the body of the paper immediately after the abstract.
- d. Center section headings. Suggested sections to include in the manuscript: *Introduction/Conceptual Framework; *Theoretical Framework; *Purpose and Research Questions or Objectives; *Methods and Procedures; *Results/Findings; * Conclusions, and *Discussion; or *other sections appropriate for qualitative, historical,
- appropriate for qualitative, historical, philosophical/theoretical, or mixed methods research.
- e. Use 12-point Times New Roman font. Single-space and left-justify paragraphs; double-space between paragraphs.
- f. Do not use headers/footers.

- g. Place tables/figures within the body of the text when they are discussed. The Table function must be used (rather than tabs and spaces) to prepare tables.
- h. Reference style should conform to APA Publication Manual (7th edition).

Poster Session

One poster session will feature multiple research studies illustrated in print form. Authors will explain their studies simultaneously to conference participants who circulate from poster to poster. Recent graduates and current graduate students are highly encouraged to submit abstracts to present posters about their studies. Research does not need to be completed to submit to a poster session proposal.

The research presented on the posters should highlight research with potential regional or national significance focusing on one of the broad areas within Career and Technical Education, Workforce Education, or Human Resource Education. Each poster should have a conceptual and/or theoretical framework, be related to a problem, and stem from sound research methodologies. The research may be quantitative, qualitative, or mixed methods.

Poster Proposal Requirements

- a. Poster title
- b. No more than 750 words (not including headings, tables, figures, and references)
- c. Single-spaced paragraphs, double-spaced between paragraphs
- d. 12-point Times New Roman font, left justified, 1" margins
- e. Tables must be prepared using the Table function (not tabs and spaces).
- f. Headings in the given order: (1) Introduction, (2) Conceptual or theoretical framework, (3) Methodology, (4) *Findings, (5) *Conclusions, (6) *Implications, and (7) References (*if data are collected and analyzed).
- g. Do not include identifying information (e.g. authors or institution).

Symposia

The symposia describe and discuss important issues emerging trends, research, or best practices, and

development of CTE professionals. Each 75-minute symposium should be a discussion or a collection of opinions. The opinions can be based on philosophical thought, professional experience, challenges in the CTE field, or a collection of published research from various sources. The symposium is not intended to be a presentation of a research paper or study.

Symposium Proposal Requirements

- a. Title
- b. Description (< 250 words): Focus on the theme and structure of the session as a whole.
- c. Justification (< 250 words): Describe why the topic is expected to be of interest to attendees and why the topic would be a good fit for a symposium session.
- d. List of symposium objectives.
- e. Summary: (< 250 words)
- f. Outline of the presentation with a brief statement of what each participant will contribute.
- g. Technical equipment needed.
- h. Do not include identifying information (e.g. authors or institution).

Research Roundtable Discussions

Research roundtable discussions are designed for working papers and research in progress. Each 90-minute session features several manuscripts, clustered by the similarity of their topic or research methodology, followed by discussions on the research projects and answering questions from the audience. The research study does not need to be completed to submit a roundtable proposal.

The CTE Research Section coordinates the double-blind, peer review of research roundtable sessions. Conference reviewers rate research roundtable proposals with these selection criteria: Purpose, conceptual or theoretical framework, methodology, and relevance to the conference theme. Research Round Table Discussion Requirements

- a. Limit the manuscript to five pages excluding references.
- b. Remove all identifying information (e.g. authors' names, location, state, institution) from the text.
- c. Do not include a title page. Instead, p. 1 should include the title (centered and bold-faced on line 1, followed by a single-spaced abstract of no more than 120 words). Begin the body of the paper immediately after the abstract.
- d. Center section headings. Suggested sections to include in the manuscript: *Introduction; *Conceptual Framework/Theoretical Framework; *Purpose and Research Questions or Objectives; *Methods and Procedures; *Initial Results/Findings (if collected); or *other sections appropriate for qualitative, historical, philosophical/theoretical, or mixed methods research.
- e. Use 12-point Times New Roman font. Single-space and left-justify paragraphs; double-space between paragraphs.

IV. Recognition

The best work in each category shall be recognized at the conference. The CTE Research Section will select one presentation for the Outstanding Research Paper Presentation, Round Table, Symposium, and Poster. Additionally, the runners-up will be recognized with a distinguished research award. Selection will be based on judges' ratings of the authors' work.
